2. Practical information for students

2.1. Visa and entry requirements

Citizens from the **EU and EEA member states** (including Iceland, Liechtenstein, Norway) and Switzerland do not require visa to travel to Austria.

Non-EU or EEA citizens need a visa for entering Austria. Students must arrange for their visa on their own. Please inform yourself about entry and visa regulations to Austria well in advance at the Austrian Embassy in your home country.

Citizen of EU/EEA countries & Switzerland:

If you are going to stay in Austria for more than 3 months you have to obtain a “Confirmation of registration (Anmeldebescheinigung)” within 4 months of entering Austria.

For the **Confirmation of registration** you need a **copy** of the following documents:

- completed and signed application form
- valid identity card or passport
- proof of a health insurance covering all the necessary costs, e.g. European Health Insurance Card, insurance policy,...[coverage at least 30 000 €]
- proof of sufficient finances, e.g. by means of savings or a bank account
- confirmation of admission by NDU
- 15 €
- 1 photo

2.2. Insurance

You need valid health insurance throughout your stay in Austria.

Students from EU countries, Iceland, Lichtenstein, Norway and Switzerland can obtain a European Health Insurance Card that gives you access to medically necessary, state-provided healthcare during a temporary stay in any of the 28 EU countries, under the same conditions and at the same cost (free in some countries) as people insured in that country.

If you need special medication, it is advisable to bring a prescription or medical instructions from your doctor with you from home.

Like all Austrian students international students have to join the **Austrian National Student Union (ÖH)** which requires a membership fee of 21,20 €. This fee includes a comprehensive liability insurance that covers costs that might occur from accidentally damaging equipment at your host institution as well as an accident insurance for injuries on-campus and on your way to and from the university. Your membership will be organised by NDU and we will send you an invoice for the fee.

3. St. Pölten

3.1. Introduction

St. Pölten is not only the oldest town in Austria, but also the capital city of Lower Austria. The long history of St. Pölten is reflected in the unique structure of the city. Many buildings in Baroque and Art Nouveau style characterise the old town and refer to the magnificent architecture of centuries long gone by. However, great present-day architects have also provided the city with modern buildings perfectly fitted into the townscape. This means that there is no strict separation between the present and the past. The city stretches to 108.48 km² with 52.145 inhabitants. It lies on the Traisen river. Located north of the Alps and south of the Wachau and is part of the Mostviertel, the southwestern region of Lower Austria. St. Pölten is located 66 km away from Vienna.

The culture and leisure program in St. Pölten is very diverse and there are plenty of possibilities to discover the town every time anew. The FM4 Frequency Festival, known all around the world, takes place once a year in Austria and attracts high-class international artists.

St. Pölten perfectly combines the old cultural city with modern lifestyle. Modern buildings in the Landhausviertel district perfectly blend in the historic picture of the old town. Concerts, festivals and other cultural offers ensure that there is something for everyone. Many guests also find the State Museum of Lower Austria particularly interesting as it shows art, culture and nature alike. In summer, St. Pölten offers leisure time pleasures with the Viehofner lake and Ratzersdorfer lake in the middle of the city. Furthermore, there are sports facilities available for a relaxing day in the water.

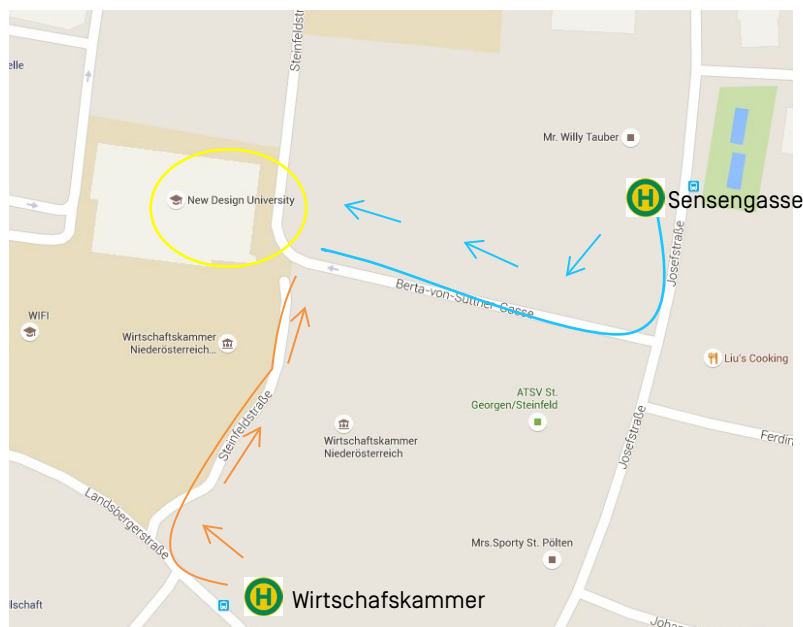
